1. Title of the Practice: School Nurturing

2. Context behind the practice:

138 No. Kashinath Vidyamandir LP School, Rupiabathan is a primary school under the Directorate of Elementary Education, Government of Assam that is in proximity to Kamrup College and serves the elementary educational needs of a very densely populated area. To address the issues of early student dropouts, community health and hygiene, financial awareness among marginalized families of students in the village and to guide students systematically towards good career paths, the college planned a scheme of adopting schools, first at elementary level and subsequently at secondary level. This school is the first to be adopted at the elementary level under the school adoption scheme of the college.

3. Objectives:

- 1. To spread educational awareness among marginalized families of students
- 2. To boost the bond between higher education and Community.
- 3. To provide supplementary educational materials and ICT equipments

- 4. To inculcate good health and hygiene practices among students and their families
- 5. To spread financial literacy among the families of students
- 6. To spread digital literacy among the students and their families

4. The Practice:

Kamrup College, Chamata regularly organizes outreach programmes at 138 No. Kashinath Vidyamandir LP School. Programmes such as digital literacy awareness programme, financial literacy awareness programme, health and hygiene awareness programme etc. are regularly organized at the school by inviting resource persons from colleges, universities and other bodies. Moreover, faculties of the college regularly visit the school to interact with students and arrange engaging activities for them. The college provides equipment and materials such as computers, books and shelves to develop the school library. The college faculties maintain contacts with the school teachers to share information about government schemes and other academic opportunities for the school children. As per G.B. Resolution Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Kamrup College, Chamata has taken the initiative to adopt the 138 No. Kashinath Vidyamandir LP School, Rupiabathan under the School Adoption Endeavour of the college. In this event, a public meeting was arranged under the chairmanship of Mr. Deba Kr. Baishya, advisor, SMC of the school. The meeting has been begun with the ritual of "lighting the lamp" and followed by an introductory speech by Dr. Debendra Kr. Bezbaruah, honourable principal of Kamrup Collage, Chamata. The purpose of the meeting was explained by the Headmaster of the school Mr. Kishore Talukdar. The school students were performed chorus in this programme which was followed by the speeches of Dr. Kabita Choudhury, Co-ordinator IQAC of Kamrup college, Md. Khairul Islam and Mr. Bhagawan Sharma. In this programme, as a part of the scheme, a set of computers, color printer and few books were donated to the school.

- 4. To spread awareness about job opportunities and educational opportunities

4. The Practice:

Kamrup College adopted the nearby village Rupiabathan Kaibartya suburi with the purpose of achieving the above objectives. The college regularly organizes awareness programmers in common gathering places of the village to spread awareness about the importance of education, Street Drama programme against superstition, Anti-Tobacco awareness programme, career opportunities, harmfulness of addictive substances and community health.
