

1. Title of the Practice: **Swachh Mission**

2. Goal

To accelerate the efforts to achieve universal sanitation coverage and to put focus on sanitation, the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, launched the Swachh Bharat Mission on 2nd October, 2014. The Mission Coordinator shall be Secretary, Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation (MDWS) with two Sub-Missions – the Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) and the Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban). The Mission aims to achieve a Swachh Bharat by 2019, as a fitting tribute to Mahatma Gandhi on his 150th birth anniversary.

The phraseology of “Swachh Mission” has, therefore, gained increasing importance with focus on the concerted efforts derivable from public and private domain and amongst college authorities.

- (I) Ensuring sanitation measures amongst students
- (II) Generating awareness on swachata (cleanliness).

3. The Context

Open defecation and sewage contamination of drinking and bathing water has been an endemic sanitary problem in India. In 2014, India was the country with the highest number of people practicing open defecation, around 530 million people

Therefore, Kamrup College, Chamata endeavours to make the students aware of the risk open defecation and on the importance maintaining hygiene and cleanliness.

4. The Practice

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

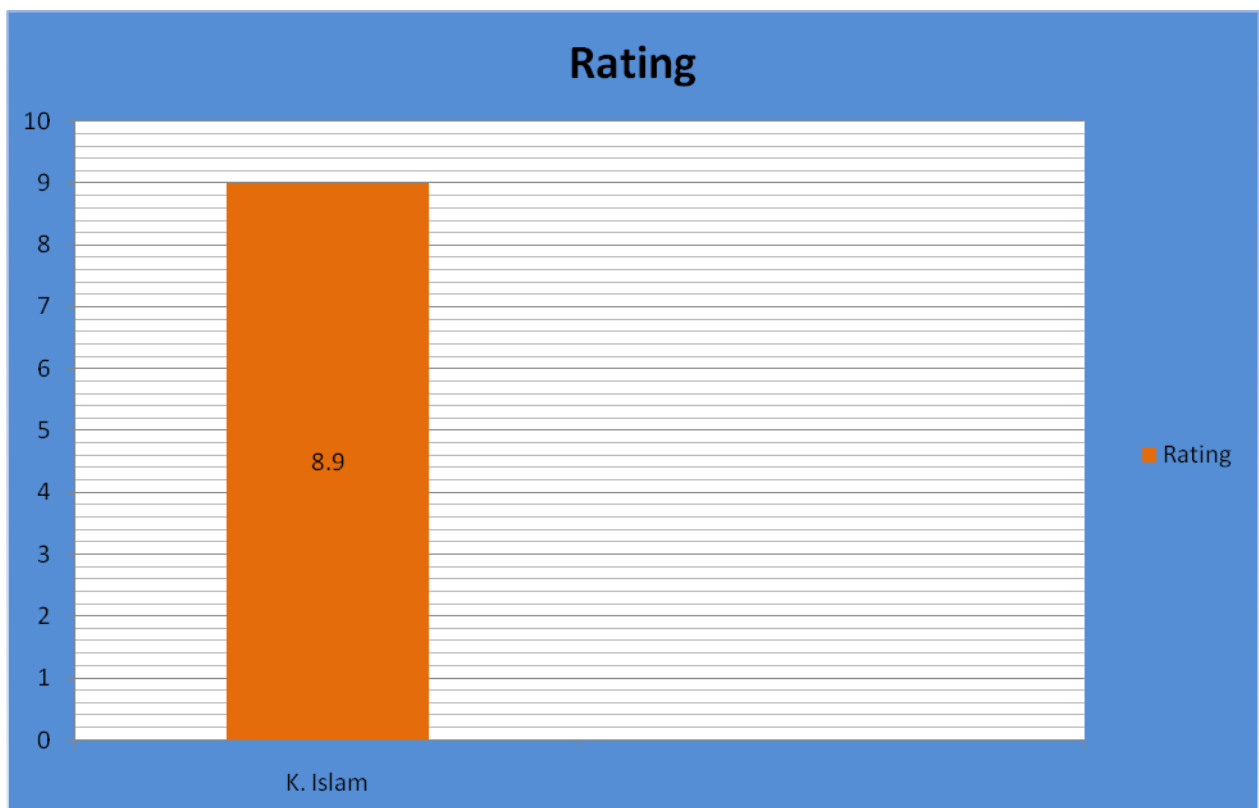
